This weekend at all the masses will be the annual blessing of hunter's. St. Hubert is the patron saint of hunters/bow hunters. Hubert was reportedly a great lover of pleasure and his chief passion was the chase, to which he devoted nearly all his time. According to the legend, Hubert was afield the morning of Good Friday (while the faithful were crowding into church) and he was participating in the chase of a deer on horseback with his famous hounds. As he was pursuing a magnificent stag, and in a clearing in the forest, the animal stopped and turned. Hubert was astounded at perceiving a crucifix suspended between its antlers, while he heard a voice from the figure of Christ say, "Hubert, unless you turn to the Lord and lead a holy life, you shall quickly fall into an abyss of Hell! Hubert dismounted immediately from his horse, fell prostrate on the ground and asked, "Lord what would you have me do?" Hubert decided to renounce all his honors, titles, and military rank. Hubert eventually became a priest and a bishop where he led many souls to Christ.
