

We served 345adults and 11 children at our Fish Fry on February 26<sup>th</sup>!





### Notes from Fr. Rich

Diocesan Scandal: As all of you know if you follow the Johnstown or Altoona news this past week a Pa Grand Jury report came out detailing the horrific sexual abuse perpetrated by priests in our Diocese mostly from the 1940's to the 1980's, but with some recent episodes as well by priests ordained before 1983 - it is important to note no priest who has been ordained after 1983 was cited in that report - I read the whole thing - which means that things have gotten better, but some horrible things went on for decades. It is sickening that priests who are supposed to be icons of Christ abused children and adolescents in unimaginable ways and that two of our former bishops covered up for them in a systematic way. Truly the work of the devil. We need to pray for all the victims of this grave evil that God can bring healing to them, and also for Bp. Bartchak and all the good priests and laity of the diocese who are suffering greatly because of the effects of this evil. There are many layers to why this happened and I won't discuss it at Mass because I don't want to scandalize the children and adolescents and even some adults with the details of this evil. Our young people should not think that all bishops, priests and religious are hypocrites or immoral. Most of us are trying with the help of God's grace to serve His people generously and take our vow to

live a pure life seriously. If any of you ever need to talk about any of this, feel free to give me a call, and please pray that a real spiritual renewal occurs in our diocese as a good to come out of this grave evil. May the Lord have mercy on us all.
