



- Altar Serving: If any student going into the 4<sup>th</sup> grade 11<sup>th</sup> grade this coming Fall is interested
  in becoming an altar server please contact me either by phone or e-mail by the end of May as I
  will have training for the new servers in June.
- Daily Mass and Eucharistic adoration: One of the great spiritual gifts of our Catholic faith is the opportunity to go to Mass during the week, if we are able to; also to be able to adore Jesus in the most Blessed Sacrament. Please try to come to daily Mass when you can and to come to our Thursday night Eucharistic Holy Hour in the Chapel at 6 pm. A good intention to pray for would be the spiritual renewal of Our Diocese in light of all the recent scandals, as well as in reparation for all the grave sins committed in the modern world, especially against Jesus in the Eucharist, as Our Lady of Fatima asked us to do.
- Making Visits to the Church: I will also try to keep the basement entrance to the main Church open during the day when I am here, so you can come to pray before our Lord in the Tabernacle or check out our lending library. If it is locked, please come to the rectory and either Melanie or Pat will let you in for a visit.
