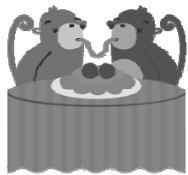

St. Gregory's Annual Festival – MacDonalton – Sunday, September 3, 2017

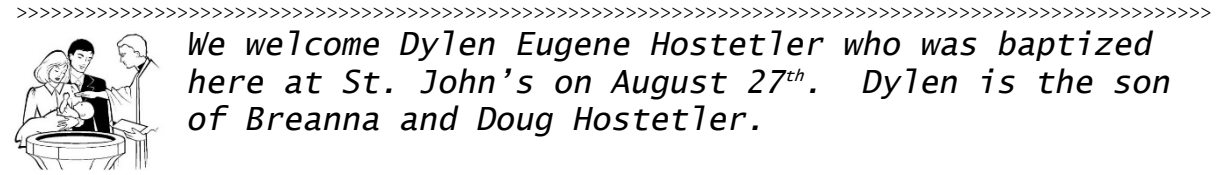
