St. John Gualbert Cathedral -Tenebrae Service:



Stewardship Reflection For Sunday March 24 2024-: Palm Sunday Of The Passion Of The Lord:
Today we celebrate Palm Sunday – the beginning of our Holy Week. Our liturgy starts with the account of
Jesus humbly entering into Jerusalem riding a donkey. People put cloaks and palm branches in His pathway
crying, "Hosanna, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" It is with great joy that Christ was
being honored as king, still in the same breath, we are filled with sorrow as we reflect on Christ's passion
and death. Thankfully, we know the glorious outcome of this painful journey. Today, as we read about the
climax of Christ's mission here on earth, we are reminded that He is the Perfect Steward, a model for us all
on our stewardship journey. Our First Reading, from the prophet Isaiah, portrays a suffering servant. The
suffering servant, in many ways, foreshadows what Jesus endured during His passion – "I gave my back to
those who beat me... my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting." Christ endured such tortures,
knowing that He did not deserve them, but still He humbly submitted to them. As we embark on this Holy
Week, let us take some time to reflect on the life of Christ as He is our model Steward, and may we strive to
imitate Him daily.



Pondering Palm Sunday:

Jesus died for you to redeem you by His blood and to free you from sin. Jesus made the ultimate sacrifice, so that we might have life. This week as we approach Easter Sunday, how can you thank God for dying for you? Think about how you can honor and remember His sacrifice in the coming days. Even in the ordinary circumstances of everyday life, we can live Easter week with our eyes turned to God. Spend some time in prayer, and thank God for the life he's given you.



Let's Walk Together This Holy Week!

What did Jesus do during His final week leading up to His Passion? Holy Week is the sacred time in which we remember and reflect on the final days of Christ's life.

This Holy Week, walk as a family alongside Jesus during the final and most important moments in His life.

A Guide Through Holy Week

As a family, take a few minutes each day this Holy Week to read the summary of that day below. Click the day to read the entire Bible story. Then, use the color to complete the activity below.

Palm Sunday

The day Jesus enters Jerusalem and the crowds joyfully sing: "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord" while waving palm branches.

Color green for the palm branches

Holy Monday

The day that Jesus cursed a fig tree outside the Jerusalem Temple. He then cleanses the Temple, overturning the money tables and exclaiming, "My house shall be called a house of prayer."

Color brown for the tables

Holy Tuesday

The next day, the apostles see that the fig tree Jesus had cursed has withered and died. Jesus then explains what this means.

Color purple for the figs

Holy Wednesday

Also known as Spy Wednesday, this is the day in which Judas Iscariot betrays Jesus for thirty pieces of silver. Color gray for the thirty pieces of silver Judas was given

Holy Thursday

The day of the Last Supper, when Jesus eats the Passover with His apostles and washes their feet. Color blue for the washing of the feet

Good Friday

The day in which Jesus is condemned to death. He carries the Cross all the way to Calvary where He is crucified and dies for our sins.

Color red for the blood of Christ

Holy Saturday

The day in which Jesus' body lays within the tomb and His soul descended into the realm of the dead, to bring the Gospel to all the righteous men and women who died before Him.

Color black for the darkness within the tomb
