#### **Stewardship Reflection February 16 2025: –Sixth Sunday In Ordinary Time:**

Today's readings speak of an essential quality for the Christian steward – hope. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "Hope is the theological virtue by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit (CCC 1817)." In many ways, this is the very definition of a stewardship way of life – focusing on eternity as we live our daily lives and relying on God to provide for our needs and satisfy our deepest longings for meaning and happiness right now. In today's Gospel, Jesus describes the character of one who is living a life of hope – the life of a Christian steward whose trust is firmly rooted in God and who is focused on others and eternity. It is not always an easy life, but it is a deeply meaningful life and one that leads to eternal reward.

**Jubilee 2025 "Pilgrims of Hope":**

The Holy Father has announced that the 2025 Church Year will be a jubilee year, something which happens every 25 years. The theme for this upcoming Jubilee year is "Pilgrims of Hope" and it will be a year of hope for a world of suffering the impacts of war, the lasting effects of the Covid- 19 pandemic and the climate crisis.

**Pilgrims' Passport:**

All are invited to use the Pilgrims Passport from December 29, 2024 to September 8 2025. These passports along with the jubilee prayer card can be found on the back table next to the jubilee banner. Pilgrims' Passport is a booklet, modeled after a Passport, includes 13 Holy Site Churches named by Bishop Mark as well as EVERY Church in our diocese. All special prayers are included. A special incentive for individuals and families to win two overnight packages and special gift cards are part of the Pilgrim's Passport. QR codes are printed in the booklet for easy access to information for directons, Mass and Confession schedules. Please encourage your people to "get on the road" during the upcoming months and enjoy the beauty, warmth and strength of rich history of our diocese. All the information is on the inside cover. Holy Site Churches will be given additional booklets and stampers.

**The Jubilee Prayer:**

May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, Pilgrims of Hope, a yearning for the treasures of heaven. May that same grace spread the joy and peace of our Redeemer throughout the earth. To you our God, eternally blessed, be glory and praise forever. Amen.

**Jubilee of Artists and the World of Culture:**

The Holy See has designated Jubilee Days in 2025 to honour various groups within the Church. In this context, The Jubilee of Artists and the World of Culture will be held from Saturday, February 15, to Tuesday, February 18, 2025. This Jubilee aims to celebrate the contributions of artists to society and the Catholic Church, while also providing them with an opportunity for spiritual renewal and reflection. Key events include an audience with Pope Francis on Saturday followed that afternoon by an international meeting titled "Sharing Hope - Horizons of Cultural Heritage". This meeting, organised in collaboration with the Vatican Museums, will bring together museum directors, academics and cultural institutions to discuss the promotion and transmission of religious and artistic heritage. On Saturday evening an exhibition of portraits by Yan Pei-Ming of prisoners from Rome's Regina Coeli prison will open at the Conciliazione 5 gallery on Via della Conciliazione. Pope Francis on Monday will become the first pontiff to visit Rome's legendary Cinecittà film studios where he will meet with artists and cultural figures. The exhibition Global Visual Poetry, celebrating 20th-century visual poetry by more than 60 artists from around the world, will open on Tuesday in Piazza Pio XII 3. The Jubilee of Artists underscores the Vatican's recognition of the vital role that art plays in human expression, cultural enrichment and the communication of faith.
