# The Legend of the Dogwood Tree

As we continue our Easter journey and reflect on the Risen Christ walking with His disciples, Christians have long found meaning in the natural world that surrounds this season of new life. One beloved piece of Christian folklore is **the Legend of the Dogwood Tree**, a story that connects the beauty of spring with the mystery of the Cross.

According to the legend, the dogwood once grew tall and strong—so sturdy that its wood was used for building. Tradition says that its timber was chosen for the Cross. After the Crucifixion, the story goes, God transformed the dogwood so it would never again grow large enough to be used for such a purpose. Instead, it became a smaller, flowering tree whose blossoms would forever bear silent witness to the Passion.

Many Christians see symbolism in the dogwood flower:

- Four white petals, shaped like a cross
- Darkened tips, recalling the nails
- A clustered center, like a crown of thorns
- A bloom that appears each spring, proclaiming resurrection and hope

While the legend is not found in Scripture, it has become a cherished reminder that all creation points toward Christ's sacrifice and the promise of new life. During this Easter season—when dogwoods bloom across our hillsides—may their blossoms invite us to recognize the Risen Lord walking with us, just as He walked with the disciples on the road to Emmaus.

## THE THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

*"He was made known to them in the breaking of the bread." – Luke 24:35*



As we continue our Easter journey, the Church invites us to reflect on the beloved story of the disciples on the road to Emmaus. Confused and discouraged, they walked away from Jerusalem — yet the Risen Christ walked beside them, listening to their hearts before revealing Himself in the bread.

This Gospel reminds us that Christ often draws near in quiet, ordinary ways:

- in the Scriptures proclaimed,
- in the Eucharist shared,
- and in the kindness of those around us.

May this Easter season renew our hope, warm our hearts, and open our eyes to the presence of Christ walking with us each day.

Today's readings focus on a theme of 'sojourning.' As Christian stewards, we know that our lives are a sojourn toward the ultimate destination of heaven. Our second reading instructs us to "conduct yourselves with reverence during the time of your sojourning, realizing that you were ransomed... with the precious blood of Christ." What a powerful reminder during the Easter season of our 'why' for embracing the stewardship way of life – we have been ransomed by our Lord's saving death and resurrection. Our lives are a gift from Him – as we sojourn through life, we are to make our lives a gift to Him in return. So, what can we do when we become discouraged - when we need our hearts set on fire once again? We can go to the same sources as the two disciples from our Gospel today on the road to Emmaus – the Scriptures (the living Word of God) and the Eucharist (the very source and summit of our faith). Frequent recourse to these two gifts from our Lord is essential to sustain us in the stewardship way of life.
